GDOT Response

- David Kenemer shared that GDOT acknowledged the good work this group has done and that we are one of three RDCs in the state that will receive funding for next year

- The review observed cars parked on the sidewalk, debris and dirt covering the sidewalk,etc.
- Because of the number of intersections, an improved map of the area was felt to be required

- A team of folks worked on a SR2S survey tools for use with parents, school administrators, and students
- The four tools were distributed today for the whole group's input. Diane can e-mail you the draft tools if you would like to review or test them
- Fed Boykin will speak at the May meeting. Fred has been involved in the GDOT funded trial programs in DeKalb
