Trails Update - latest developments along the Pinhoti Trail and beyond....... Larry Madden

- The 200+ acres conservation purchase last fall connects the Lyerly Rail Trail with the Pinhoti Trail head on GA 100. this will eliminate about a 1 ½ mile road walk.
- Plans are underway to improve the Lyerly Rail Trail from the Simms Mountain Trail to Lyerly

Events

- The walking events for LaFayette and Trenton were deferred, since no representatives were present
- Joe Anderson passed around a prototype of the Silver Comet Loop map. Minor suggestions were made and Joe will proceed with production
- Sheri Henshaw reviewed the status of the new Bartow brochure with a larger credit to BWNWGA. No specific dollar request was made (\$2,000 was allocated last year)

BWNWGA website

Regional Bicycle Routes

- The map has been updated with color-coded routes.
