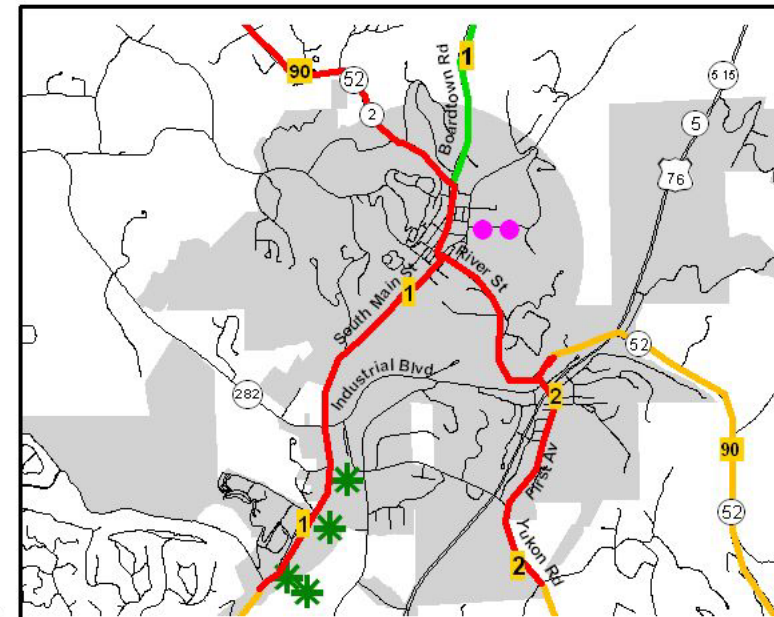
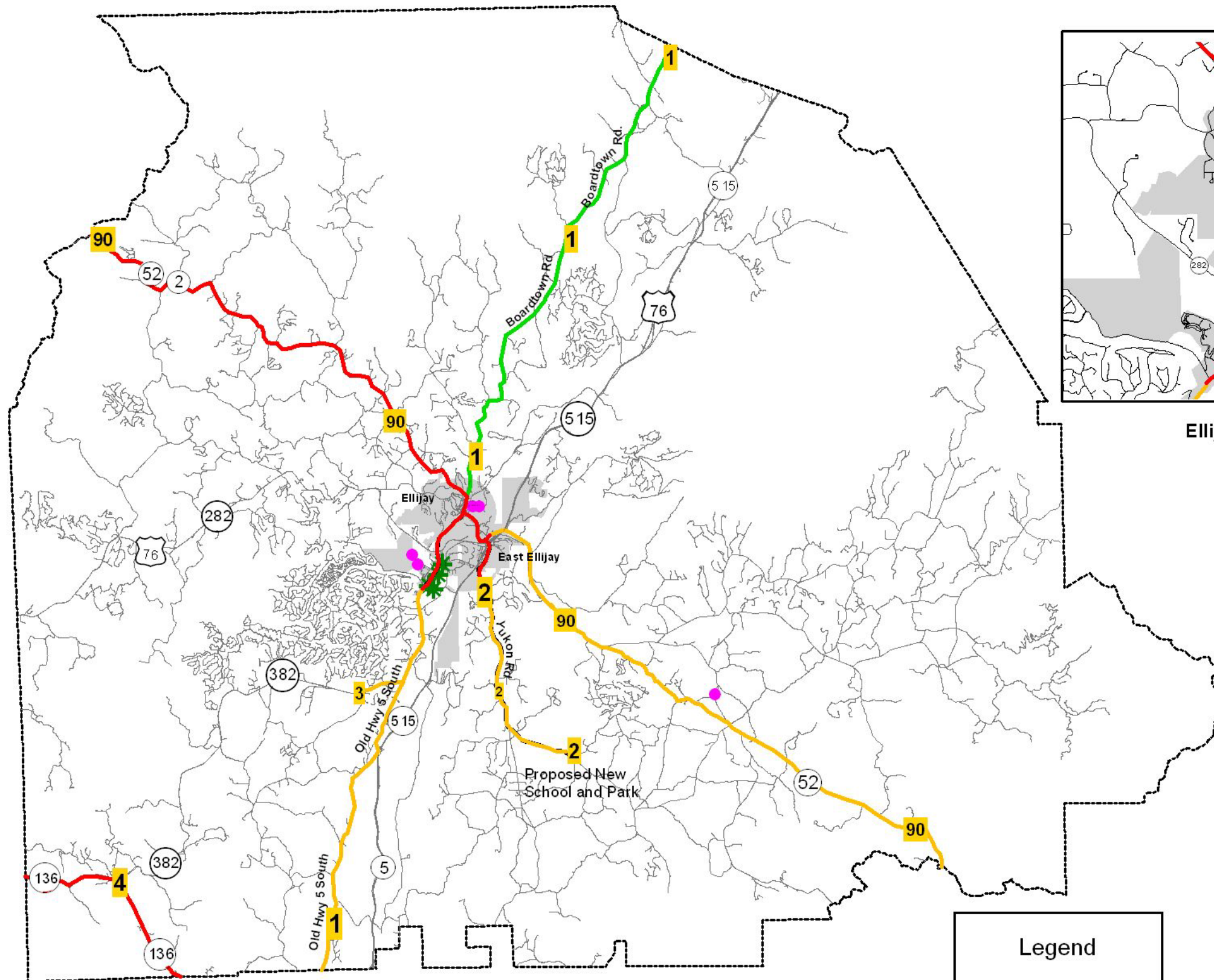


Gilmer County Bicycle Route Map

Route Ratings

- █ **Green = Least Difficulty Bicycling.** Generally has at least three of the following features - low traffic volumes, slower speed traffic, lane widths adequate to provide cyclist maneuvering room, terrain is relatively flat.
- █ **Orange = Moderate Difficulty Bicycling.** Generally has at least three of the following features - traffic volumes are moderate, moderate speed traffic, lane widths are adequate to provide cyclist maneuvering room, terrain is moderately rolling.
- █ **Red = Most Difficulty Bicycling.** Generally has at least three of the following features - heavy traffic volumes, high traffic speed, lane widths less than desired for maneuvering, steeper terrain.

Route Descriptions

- Route 90 "Mountain Crossing"** - This State designated route enters Gilmer County on Ga. Hwy 52 from Murray County, travels through Ellijay / East Ellijay and continues east on Ga. Hwy 52 to Dawson County. The section from Murray County to Ellijay is very steep with lots of curves.
- Route 1** - follows Boardtown Rd from Ellijay to Sugar Creek Rd. in Fannin County and Old Hwy 5 South into Pickens County. Traffic volumes will be heavy in the Ellijay area, but diminish in the rural areas.
- Route 2** - begins at the Route 90 in Ellijay and follows First Ave. in East Ellijay and Yukon Rd. to the proposed new High School
- Route 3** - begins at Route 1 on Old Highway 5 South and travels up Ga. Hwy 382 to Coosawattee River Resort.
- Route 4** - This short segment is on Ga. Hwy 136 connecting Pickens County and Murray Counties.
