Route Ratings

Green = Least Difficulty

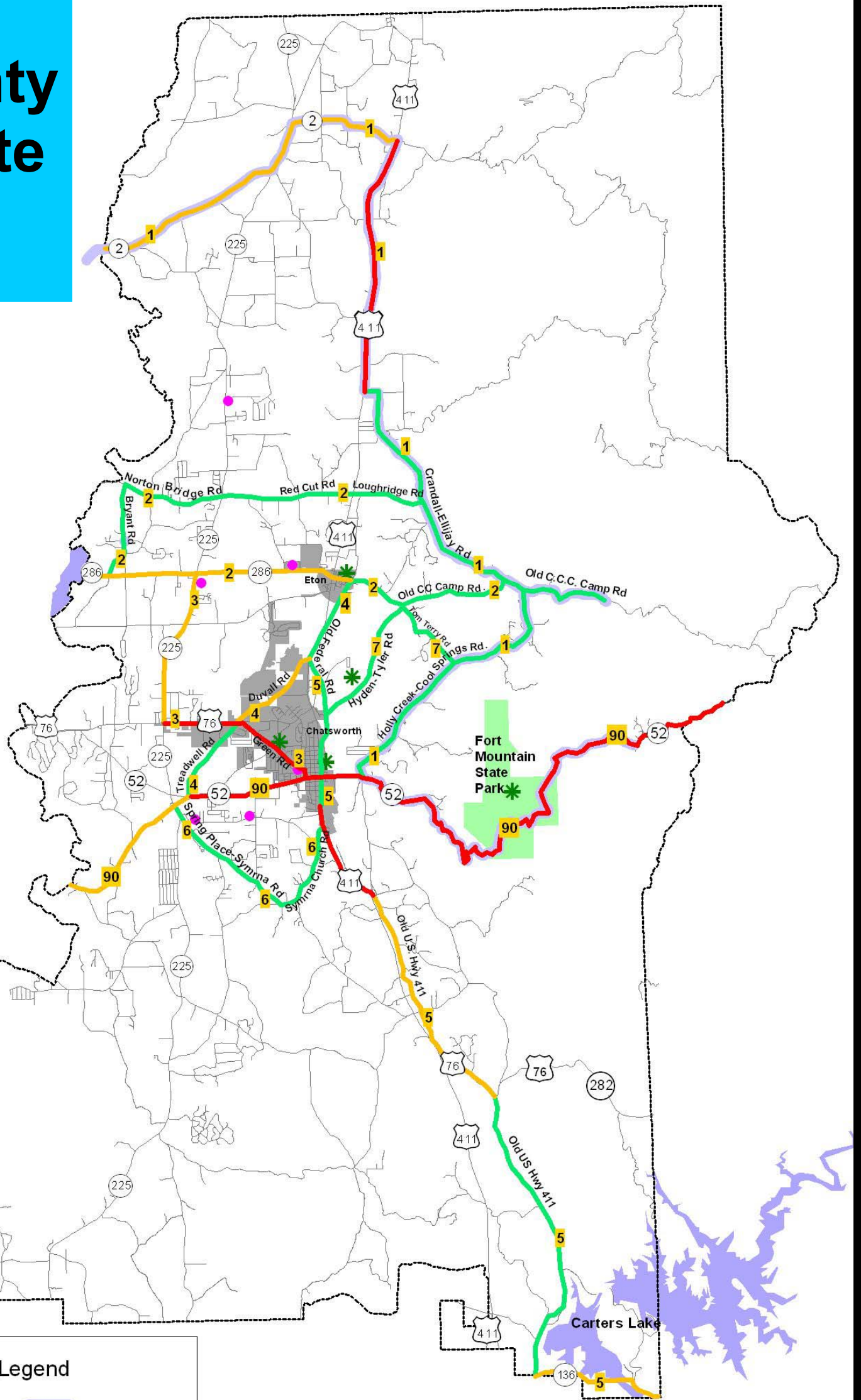
Bicycling. Generally has at least three of the following features - low traffic volumes, slower speed traffic, lane widths adequate to provide cyclist maneuvering room, terrain is relatively flat.

Orange = Moderate Difficulty

Bicycling. Generally has at least three of the following features - traffic volumes are moderate, moderate speed traffic, lane widths are adequate to provide cyclist maneuvering room, terrain is moderately rolling.

Red = Most Difficulty

Bicycling. Generally has at least three of the following features - heavy traffic volumes, high traffic speed, lane widths less than desired for maneuvering, steeper terrain.

Route Descriptions

Route 90 “Mountain Crossing” Bike Route- This official State designated route enters Murray County from Whitfield County on Tibbs Bridge Road, goes through Spring Place to Ga. Hwy 52 (Alternate) through Chatsworth, and follows Ga. Hwy 52 past Fort Mountain State Park to Gilmer County. The section from Chatsworth past the State Park is very steep. Length: approximately 17 miles.

Route 1 - The Cohutta-Chattahoochee Scenic Byway route enters western Murray County on Ga. Hwy 2 to U.S. Hwy 411, follows U.S. 411 to Crandall-Ellijay Rd to Old CCC Camp Rd. to Holly Creek-Cool Springs Road to Ga. Hwy 52 where it intersects with Route 90. Length: 23 miles.

Route 2 - forms a loop that begins at Route 1 on Crandall-Ellijay Road. It stretches along Loughridge Road, Red Cut Road, Norton Bridge Road, Bryant Rd, SR 286, and Old CCC Camp Road through scenic rural areas. Length: approximately 16 miles.

Route 3 - connects the middle school at the intersection of Ga. Hwy 286 and Ga. Hwy 225 and downtown Chatsworth via Ga. Hwy 225, US 76 and Green Road where it ends at Ga. Hwy 52. Length: approximately 6.5 miles.

Route 4 - connects the City of Eton and the Spring Place community along Treadwell Rd., Duvall Road, and Old Federal Road. Length: 5.6 miles.

Route 5 - Located in the southwest portion of Murray County, this route connects downtown Chatsworth with the Carters Lake area via U.S.411, Old U.S. 411, and Ga. Hwy 136. Length: approximately 16.5 miles.

Route 6 - acts as a southern by-pass loop around Chatsworth. Located along Spring Place and Symrna Church Road, it connects to Route 5. Length: approximately 5 miles.

Route 7 - travels to the County Park on Hyden-Tyler Road from Chatsworth and connects to Routes 1 and 2 via Tom Terry Road. Length: 4.5 miles.
